

ADDENDUM

Race 1 of 04.07.20 - The Stud Master – Cancer Support Cup

On inquiry, it was established that **Seven Carat** (Bheekary) from a wide draw, had been urged forward and passing the 1300 metres shifted in marginally with **He's Got Gears** (Apprentice Roy), which was racing on his inside and hanging in, carrying **Phoenix Rising** (David) inwards with **Midnight Messenger** (Hoolash) becoming cramped for room and having to be checked to avoid the heels of **Phoenix Rising**. After consideration, the Racing Stewards being of the opinion that the blame could not be apportioned on any one rider, decided not to proceed further other than to report this as a racing incident. Jockey Bheekary was however reprimanded and advised to allow for more room to runners on his inside in future.

RACE 1 – THE PRODIGAL - CANCER SUPPORT CUP – 1600M

With six horses loaded, the starting gates opened prematurely without being prompted, resulting in the horses that were loaded jumping out. The Starter called a false start, where the horses were quickly reined in, brought back to the start, examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon and reloaded.

Deer Park – Jumped awkwardly, brushed the left side of its gate and was slow to begin. Passing the 1400 metres, was inconvenienced and taken out to avoid heels. **Leaving the 250 metres, was switched to the inside of The Barrister to secure clear running.**

Fairbanks – From its wide draw, was taken across to race behind runners. Passing the 450 metres, was taken out to improve its position and raced wide from then onwards. When questioned regarding the handling of this gelding in the early stages, trainer Allet explained that with respect to its wide draw he instructed apprentice Roy to endeavour to settle his mount at the back of the field and move from approaching the 300 metres. Apprentice Roy explained that with the horse jumping better than he expected it to, he had to restrain the gelding to ride as per his instructions with **Fairbanks** throwing its head when being restrained. When further questioned, apprentice Roy explained that **Fairbanks**, being a horse that tends to over-race, was apprehensive from improving on the inside of **Slightly Scottish** in case the latter was taken inwards. When questioned, Mr. Allet explained that **apprentice Roy** might have overdone the instructions due to his inexperience and the fact that **Fairbanks** is a difficult horse, which tends to pull in its races. After consideration, the Stewards decided not to proceed further other than to advise apprentice Roy to show more judgment whilst riding in races and advised Mr. Allet to refrain from declaring apprentice Roy on difficult horses.

Kings Empire – Carried wide leaving the 400 metres.

Midnight Oracle – Stood flat-footed, losing considerable ground at the start. Approaching the 1400 metres, commenced to race fiercely and had to be eased and taken out when awkwardly placed close to the heels of **Kings Empire**. **Deer Park**, which was following, was inconvenienced and had to be taken out when awkwardly placed close to its heels. **Leaving the 200 metres, was inconvenienced and had to be switched to the outside of The Barrister to continue going forward.**

Star Of Zeus – Slow to begin. Leaving the 1500 metres was cramped for room on the inside of **Kings Empire** and taken inwards onto **Lady's Knight** with the latter being cramped for room and having to be eased, losing its position. Approaching the 400 metres was taken out from behind **The Barrister** to improve its position and, in doing so, carried **Kings Empire** wider on the track.

Lady's Knight – Cramped for room near the 1400 metres, losing its position. **Dipped passing the 600 metres.**

Middle Path – Slow to begin. Raced fiercely in the early stages, and approaching the 1100 metres raced fiercely when awkwardly placed close to the heels of **Kings Empire**. Leaving the 900 metres, was taken out and allowed to stride forward to secure the lead.

The Barrister – In the early stages of the home straight, when being ridden with the whip in the left hand, hung in and leaving the 200 metres, when being straightened, shifted ground outwards. **Midnight Oracle**, which was following, became inconvenienced and had to be switched to its outside to continue going forward.

Bypass – Raced wide throughout.

GENERAL

On inquiry, jockey Allyhosain (**Kings Empire**) pleaded guilty to a charge under MTC Rule 160 A (f) in that passing the 1300 metres, he carelessly allowed his mount to shift in when insufficiently clear of **Star Of Zeus**, which was racing on his inside, with the latter running out of galloping room and having to be checked and taken inwards, thereby crowding **Lady's Knight**, which was racing on its inside with **Lady's Knight** having to be checked and losing its position. He was suspended from riding in races for two Mauritian race meetings and fined Rs.25,000.

Result: 1st: **Deer Park**, 2nd: **Star of Zeus**, 3rd: **Fairbanks...**, 4th: **Midnight Oracle**

RACE 2 – THE CHATTURGOON HURCHUND MEMORIAL TROPHY – 1450M

Correct weight was withheld for the Stewards to review the video replays of the home straight. It was established that **Cash Call** had shifted ground inwards, carrying **Lagacio** inwards for a short distance leaving the 100 metres, with jockey Allyhosain straightening **Cash Call** and running away from **Lagacio** over the concluding stages. After consideration, the Stewards decided not to proceed further and correct weight was declared on the Judges' semaphored numbers.

Inertia – Slow to begin

Tanjiro – Passing the 400 metres, had to be eased when awkwardly placed close to the heels of **High Key**, which had shifted in abruptly.

Cash Call – Raced wide in the early stages. Passing the 400 metres, was taken out to improve its position and made the turn into the home straight in a very wide position. Approaching the 100 metres, commenced to shift ground inwards, and leaving the 100 metres, carried **Lagacio** inwards for a short distance before being straightened. Jockey Allyhosain was shown the video replays of the incident, severely reprimanded and advised that he should straighten his mounts earlier than he did on this occasion.

Lagacio – Slow into stride. Approaching the 800 metres, when the pace slowed, was taken out to avoid the heels of **After The Order** and, in doing so, carried **Newsman** wider on the track. Inconvenienced passing the 700 metres. Carried inwards for a short distance leaving the 100 metres.

Newsman – Carried wide at the 800 metres. Raced wide leaving the 450 metres.

Copenhagen – Approaching the 700 metres, when being restrained, got its head up, raced ungenerously and shifted ground outwards, inconveniencing **Lagacio**. Hung out in the home straight.

High Key – Over-raced in the middle stages. Leaving the 800 metres, whilst over-racing, was awkwardly placed on the heels of **After The Order**. Approaching the 700 metres, was taken out from behind the heels of **After The Order**. Hung in in the home straight and proved difficult to assist.

Temp The Tiger – Slow to begin and shortly after, was taken across to race behind runners. Approaching the 1100 metres commenced to race fiercely and raced into a gap between **King's Story** and **Cash Call**, and, when being restrained, threw its head and raced ungenerously for some distance.

After The Order – Prior to the start, was fractious and reared in its gate. Approaching the 200 metres, was switched to the inside of **Copenhagen** to secure clear running. Hung out in the home straight.

GENERAL

On inquiry, jockey Boutanive (**Copenhagen**) pleaded guilty to a charge under Rule 160 A (d) in that from leaving the 900 metres, he excessively reduced the speed of his mount, thereby causing interference directly to **After The Order** and indirectly to **Lagacio**, which were following, with both horses having to be eased and taken out. He was fined Rs.10,000.

Result: 1st: **Cash Call**, 2nd: **Lagacio**, 3rd: **After The Order**, 4th: **High Key**

RACE 3 – PRIX DU CENTENAIRE DE L'ALLIANCE FRANCAISE – 1600M

Overdose - Slow to begin, and **shortly after**, was taken across to race behind runners. Passing the 400 metres, was taken out to improve its position and raced wide into the home straight.

Burg – Leaving the 400 metres, was taken out to improve its position and raced wide from then onwards.

Siberian Husky – Slow to begin. Leaving the 1300 metres, was inconvenienced and had to be eased to avoid heels. Approaching the 100 metres, was switched to the inside of **Burg** to continue going forward.

Confessional – Came off the crossing at the 1300 metres awkwardly and stumbled. Shortly thereafter, had to be restrained when awkwardly placed close to the heels of **Eight Cities. Siberian Husky**, which was following, was also inconvenienced and had to be eased with **Why Wouldn't Yew**, which was following **Siberian Husky**, becoming inconvenienced and having to shift out to avoid its heels. Near the 300 metres, had to be steadied when awkwardly placed close to the heels of **Pride Rock**. Leaving the 200 metres, was switched to the inside of **Sand Path** to secure clear running.

Sand Path – Approaching the 100 metres, when being ridden with the whip, commenced to shift ground outwards, resulting in **Pride Rock**, which was following, becoming inconvenienced close to its heels passing the 100 metres and having to be checked.

Pride Rock – **Dipped on jumping**. Leaving the 100 metres, when improving on the outside of **Sand Path**, the latter commenced to shift ground outwards, with **Pride Rock** having to be eased to avoid its heels.

Why Wouldn't Yew - Leaving the 1300 metres, was inconvenienced and had to be eased to avoid heels. Approaching the 200 metres, was switched to the outside of runners to continue going forward.

GENERAL

On inquiry, jockey Sooful (**Sand Path**) pleaded guilty to a charge under MTC Rule 160 A (f) in that he carelessly allowed his mount to shift in passing the 100 metres, with **Pride Rock** that was improving on his outside, having to be eased to avoid the heels of **Sand Path**. He was suspended from riding in two Mauritian race meetings.

Result: 1st: **Why Wouldn't Yew**, 2nd: **Confessional**, 3rd: **Cyber Special**, 4th: **Burg**

RACE 4 – THE SERGE HENRY CUP – 1600M

Charleston Hero – Stood flat-footed and was slow to begin. Shortly thereafter, crowded for room, shifted ground inwards and bumped **Kemal Kavur**. Passing the 500 metres was taken out to improve its position and raced wide from then onwards. Jockey Boutanive dropped his whip leaving the 100 metres.

Potawatomi – Carried in shortly after the start, crowding **Charleston Hero**. Raced wide throughout.

Driven Force – Jumped awkwardly and shifted ground inwards, crowding **Potawatomi** onto **Charleston Hero**. **Charleston Hero** then shifted ground inwards and bumped **Kemal Kavur** on its hindquarter with the latter becoming unbalanced and turning sideways. When questioned, jockey Juglall explained that this gelding was having its second run in Mauritius. He added that at its first outing, it was urged forward to race with the pace and eventually faded out over the concluding stages. As such, for today's race, he was instructed to let the gelding race at its own pace and settle it where comfortable in the race, the intention being that the gelding would quicken this time and run an improved race. He further said that after jumping well, he found himself running in a one off position, just behind the leaders and that leaving the 1000 metres, when the pace slackened, he allowed his mount to improve to race closer to the lead and from approaching the 400 metres, when asked for an effort, his mount took some time to quicken and was doing its best work at the finish.

Northern Spy – Shifted ground inwards shortly after the start, inconveniencing **Supreme Orator**. Over the concluding stages, shifted ground inwards slightly inconveniencing **Texas Sky**.

Subtropical – Leaving the 400 metres, had to be restrained over some distance when awkwardly placed close to the heels of **Northern Spy**.

West Coast Warrior – Slow into stride. Approaching the 300 metres, for some distance, was held up when unable to improve from behind **Subtropical**, and leaving the 250 metres, was switched to the inside of **Subtropical** to secure clear running.

Supreme Orator – Slow to begin, and shortly thereafter, was carried inwards. Raced wide throughout.

Kemal Kavur – Bumped shortly after the start, turned sideways and became unbalanced. Raced wide in the early stages. Leaving the 1100 metres, commenced to race fiercely and approaching the 1000 metres, when being settled, put its head up and raced ungenerously for some distance.

Result: 1st: **Northern Spy**, 2nd: **Driven Force**, 3rd: **Texas Sky**, 4th: **Charleston Hero**

RACE 5 – THE SIR BEDE CLIFFORD CUP – 1500M

Correct weight was withheld for the Stewards to view the video replays of the home straight. It was established that from approaching the 200 metres, **Red Mars** commenced to shift ground inwards with jockey Allyhosain putting his whip away and straightening the latter, however approaching the 100 metres, when being ridden with the whip, **Red Mars** commenced to shift ground inwards. At the same time, **Ovation Award** was being ridden with the whip in the right hand with these two horses racing close to each other. **Ovation Award** then commenced to shift ground inwards, with jockey Juglall putting his whip away and straightening the latter. The Stewards, being satisfied that there was no contact between the two horses, with none of the two horses being inconvenienced, decided not to proceed further and correct weight was declared on the Judges' semaphored numbers.

Sir Bernadini – Passing the 200 metres, commenced to shift ground outwards and bumped **Yankeedoodledandy**, which was improving on its outside with the latter then shifting ground outwards, bumping with **Ovation Award**, which was being taken inwards to improve on the inside of **Promissory**.

Ovation Award – Approaching the 200 metres, was switched to the inside of **Promissory** to secure clear running. Leaving the 100 metres, commenced to shift ground outwards under pressure, **inconveniencing Promissory**. Over the concluding stages shifted ground inwards with jockey Juglall putting his whip away and straightening his mount. **Jockey Juglall was shown the video replays of the concluding stages, reprimanded and advised to straighten his mounts earlier than he did on this occasion, in future.**

Spring Man – Slow to begin and, shortly after, had to be steadied to avoid the heels of **Sacred Flame**, which had jumped inwards. **Jumped the crossing at the 450 metres. Passing the 300 metres, had to be eased to avoid the heels of Consul Of War.**

The Byzantine – Was fractious prior to the start being effected and jumped awkwardly, being slow to begin. **On jumping, a hood that was being used in the adjacent stall, was caught on jockey Hoolash's right foot, and remained in place till after the finish.** Raced fiercely in the early stages, and when being settled passing the 1300 metres, threw its head and raced ungenerously for some distance.

Red Mars – **Shortly after the start, shied away from Sacred Flame and shifted ground inwards, carrying Promissory inwards onto Consul Of War. Passing the 400 metres, was taken out to improve its position and raced wide into the home straight. Hung in in the home straight.**

Yankeedoodledandy – Jumped awkwardly and was slow to begin. Bumped near the 200 metres.

Sacred Flame – Shifted ground inwards on jumping. Raced wide in the early stages.

Promissory – **Carried inwards shortly after the start. Inconvenienced leaving the 100 metres. Over the concluding stages, had to be switched to the outside of Red Mars to continue going forward.**

Consul Of War – **Standing awkwardly in its gate, and was slow to begin. Leaving the 250 metres, had to be switched inwards when awkwardly placed close to the heels of Yankeedoodledandy.**

GENERAL

On inquiry, jockey Sooful (Consul Of War) pleaded guilty to a charge under rule 160 A (d) for failing to take the necessary steps to ensure that his mount did not interfere with another runner, in that after he had allowed his mount to shift out leaving the 400 metres, he took his mount back inwards approaching the 300 metres, resulting in Spring Man which was improving on his inside having to be eased when awkwardly placed close to its heels. He was fined Rs.15,000.

Result: 1st: **Red Mars**, 2nd: **Ovation Award**, 3rd: **Consul Of War**, 4th: **Promissory**

RACE 6 - THE BOTANIQUE CUP – 990M

Pera Palace – Slow to begin and shortly thereafter, was cramped for room between **Rob Roy** and **Palace Chapel**.

Lickerio – Jumped awkwardly and brushed the right side of its gate, being slow to begin. **Passing the 100 metres, was switched to the outside of Palace Chapel to continue going forward.**

Palace Chapel – Hung in in the home straight.

Wavebreaker – Near the 750 metres, clipped the heels of **Henry Tudor** and stumbled. Approaching the 450 metres, had to be checked for a number of strides when **Tripod** shifted in when insufficiently clear.

Gunston – Leaving the 200 metres, was switched to the inside of **Wavebreaker** to secure clear running.

Maxamore – Passing the 300 metres, was taken out to improve its position and in doing so carried **Rob Roy** wider on the track. Hung out in the early stages of the home straight with jockey Juglall switching his whip to his left hand. **Approaching the 100 metres, slightly inconvenienced Rob Roy.**

Rob Roy – Leaving the 800 metres, shifted ground inwards and bumped **Maxamore**. Near the 650 metres, had to be eased when awkwardly placed close to the heels of **Palace Chapel**, which had been taken in. Raced wide from approaching the 450 metres. **Carried wide leaving the 300 metres. Slightly inconvenienced approaching the 100 metres.**

GENERAL

a) On inquiry, Jockey Ségeon (**Tripod**) pleaded guilty to a charge under Rule 160 A (f) in that approaching the 450 metres, he carelessly allowed his mount to shift in when insufficiently clear of **Wavebreaker**, which was racing on his inside, causing the latter to run out of galloping room and having to be checked. He was suspended from riding in races for one race meeting and fined Rs.25,000.

b) On inquiry, it was established that jockey Boutanive (**Rob Roy**) who has been instructed to lead, urged his mount forward after missing the start, resulting in his mount commencing to over race passing the 800 metres and when being restrained got its head up, shifted ground inwards marginally and became awkwardly placed close to the heels of **Wavebreaker** which had shifted ground outwards. After consideration, the Stewards being of the opinion that the incident occurred partly due to jockey Boutanive's insistence in chasing into a settled field decided not to proceed further other than to advise jockey Boutanive that he should show better judgement in future when riding in races.

Result: 1st: **Tripod**, 2nd: **Henry Tudor**, 3rd: **Palace Chapel**, 4th: **Lickerio**

RACE 7 – THE MAURITIUS JOCKEY CLUB GOLDEN JUBILEE CUP – 1400M

Following the running of the race, the Stewards considered an objection lodged by jockey Bardottier, the rider of **Wall Tag**, which was declared 2nd, against **Rule The Night**, which was declared the winner, on the grounds of interference over the final 200 metres. Evidence was taken from both riders and trainers. It was established that near the 200 metres, **Wall Tag** and **Rule The Night** came together, when **Wall Tag** shifted out marginally and **Rule The Night** shifted in marginally, with jockey Juglall then straightening his mount. Passing the 100 metres, **Rule The Night** shifted in marginally, making contact with **Wall Tag**. Passing the 75 metres, when being ridden with the whip, **Wall Tag** commenced to shift ground outwards and carried **Rule The Night** outwards over the concluding stages. The Stewards, taking into consideration that there was movement from both horses, that both riders never stopped riding at any stage and that **Rule The Night** was always in front of **Wall Tag**, decided to dismiss the objection and the correct weight was declared on the Judges' semaphored numbers.

Rule The Night – Approaching the 1300 metres, was hanging in, shifted ground inwards and had to be steadied to avoid the heels of **Al Mariachi** which had shifted out marginally, thereafter continued to hang in and shifted inwards. Leaving the 400 metres was taken out to improve its position. Near the 200 metres, shifted in marginally, coming together with **Wall Tag**, which had shifted out marginally, with jockey Juglall then straightening his mount. Passing the 100 metres, shifted in marginally, making contact with **Wall Tag**.

Wall Tag – On jumping, came into contact with **Silken Prince**. Near the 200 metres, shifted out marginally and came together with **Rule The Night**, which had shifted in marginally. Passing the 75 metres, when being ridden with the whip, commenced to shift ground outwards and carried **Rule The Night** outwards over the concluding stages.

Al Mariachi – Approaching the 1300 metres and carried out marginally. Raced fiercely in the middle stages.

Perovskia – Slow into stride. Inconvenienced passing the 1300 metres.

Haylor – Hesitated at the start, and was slow into stride. Passing the 1300 metres, crowded for room and steadied, becoming unbalanced.

Silken Prince – On jumping, came into contact with **Wall Tag**. Passing the 1300 metres, was cramped on the inside of **Haylor**, which was crowded for room by **Rule The Night**, which had shifted in when insufficiently clear, ran out of galloping room and had to be severely checked, losing its position.

Perovskia, which was following, was inconvenienced and taken out to avoid the heels of **Silken Prince**.

GENERAL

On inquiry, jockey Juglall (**Rule The Night**) was found guilty for a contravention of rule 160 A (f) in that passing the 1300 metres he carelessly allowed his mount to shift in when insufficiently clear of **Haylor**, resulting in the latter being crowded onto **Silken Prince**, with **Silken Prince** being badly cramped for galloping room, bumping the running rails and having to be severely checked. He was suspended to ride in races for one Mauritian race meeting and fined a sum of Rs.25,000.

Result: 1st: **Rule The Night**, 2nd: **Wall Tag**, 3rd: **Haylor**, 4th: **Al Mariachi**

RACE 8 – THE WINKING CUP – 990M

The start was delayed when **Grey Again** proved very difficult to load.

Amandla – Jumped awkwardly, and was carried inwards shortly thereafter. Leaving the 100 metres, was switched to the outside of **Birthday Boy** to continue going forward and, in doing so, inconvenienced **Mr**

Mogambo. Jockey Hoolash was shown the video replays of the incident and advised to be more subtle when shifting ground in future and avoid abrupt actions.

Birthday Boy – Shortly after the start, shifted ground inwards abruptly, carrying **Amandla** inwards. Raced fiercely in the middle stages. Leaving the 200 metres, commenced to shift ground inwards, resulting in **Greenflashsunset**, which was improving on its inside, being carried inwards at the 100 metres, hesitating and shifting ground outwards despite jockey Rama's attempt to straighten it. **Amandla**, which was following, was switched to the outside of **Birthday Boy** to continue going forward and when being taken out, inconvenienced **Mr Mogambo**, which was improving on its outside. Jockey Boutanive was shown the video replays of this incident, severely reprimanded and advised to straighten his mounts earlier than he did on this occasion.

Double Winner – Slow to begin. Leaving the 400 metres, was taken out and raced wide rounding the home turn.

Grey Again – Jumped awkwardly and shifted ground inwards, making contact with **Mr Mogambo**.

Mr Mogambo – Jumped awkwardly and shifted ground outwards, making contact with **Grey Again**, which had jumped awkwardly and shifted ground inwards. Inconvenienced near the 100 metres.

The Riddler – Slow to begin. Came off the crossing at the 450 metres awkwardly and dipped.

Greenflashsunset – Shortly after the start, shifted ground outwards. Carried inwards at the 100 metres, hesitated and shifted ground outwards, despite jockey Rama's attempt to straighten it.

Result: 1st: **Greenflashsunset**, 2nd: **Mr Mogambo**, 3rd: **Amandla**, 4th: **Birthday Boy**

RACE 9 – THE CHICKADEE PLATE – 1400M

Jockey R. Boutanive, who was injured his left calf muscle, was stood down by the Club's medical officer prior to the running of this race. The Stewards approved Jockey J. Allyhosain as the replacement rider for **King Of Tara**.

The Stewards ordered the withdrawal of **Mr Bombastic**, which proved extremely difficult to load. In view of this, all bets on **Mr Bombastic** were ordered to be refunded and fixed odds winning bets were paid less 3 cents per rupee, the average price of **Mr Bombastic** being 29-1. **Mr Bombastic is required to pass barrier trials until being certified tractable by the starter.**

King Of Tara – Stood awkwardly in its gate, jumped awkwardly and was slow to begin. Passing the 1300 metres, raced tight on the inside of **Freddie Flint** for a short distance. Leaving the 100 metres, when being ridden with the whip in the right hand, commenced to shift ground outwards and slightly inconvenienced **Silver Song**. Jockey Allyhosain was shown the video replays of the home straight, severely reprimanded and advised to straighten his mounts earlier than he did on this occasion.

Yankee Force – Slow to begin. Eased passing the 1300 metres.

Captain Moss – Slow into stride. Raced wide throughout.

Artax – Raced wide throughout.

Seventh Express – Slow to begin. Raced green. Leaving the 1200 metres, had difficulty in negotiating the turn, threw its head and raced ungenerously for some distance. Approaching the 800 metres, commenced to race fiercely and when being eased to avoid the heels of **Greatfiveight**, shifted out abruptly. Raced wide from the 600 metres. When questioned, jockey Bardottier explained that from leaving the 1200 metres, his mount commenced to race fiercely and when being restrained, got its head up and shifted out, proving very difficult to assist. He added that passing the 800 metres, when being eased to avoid the heels of **Greatfiveight**, his mount again got its head up and would not settle. He then elected to take his mount out and let it improve around horses. He further added that rounding the final turn, **Seventh Express** felt unbalanced and did not negotiate the bend properly.

Freddie Flint – Leaving the 450 metres, was taken out to improve its position and raced wide from then onwards. Jockey Chumon was shown the video replays passing the 1300 metres, severely reprimanded and advised to allow for more room to runners on his inside, in future.

GENERAL

On inquiry, Trainer Sewdyal explained that he instructed jockey Hoolash (**Artax**) to insist on this gelding for 50 metres and endeavour to lead and if not able to lead, settle the gelding where comfortable. Jockey Hoolash confirmed these instructions and explained that after jumping well he insisted on his mount which did show the expected initial speed resulting in runners on his inside improving and as such he had been caught wide leaving the 1300 metres. Thereafter, racing in a three-wide position he did not want to place his mount at a disadvantage and insist too much in the middle stages and elected to stay in this position. He added that from passing the 600 metres he had to niggle at his mount to keep up with the leaders and,

when asked for an effort passing the 400 metres Artax did not quicken and faded thereafter. When questioned, Trainer Sewdya opined that jockey Hoolash ought to have insisted more in view to secure the lead, but at the same time realised that had he done so he might not have secured the lead and would still have been caught wide. After consideration, the Board decided not to proceed further other than to tell Jockey Hoolash that his ride had come under notice and advise him to ride his horses so as to leave no room for query.
